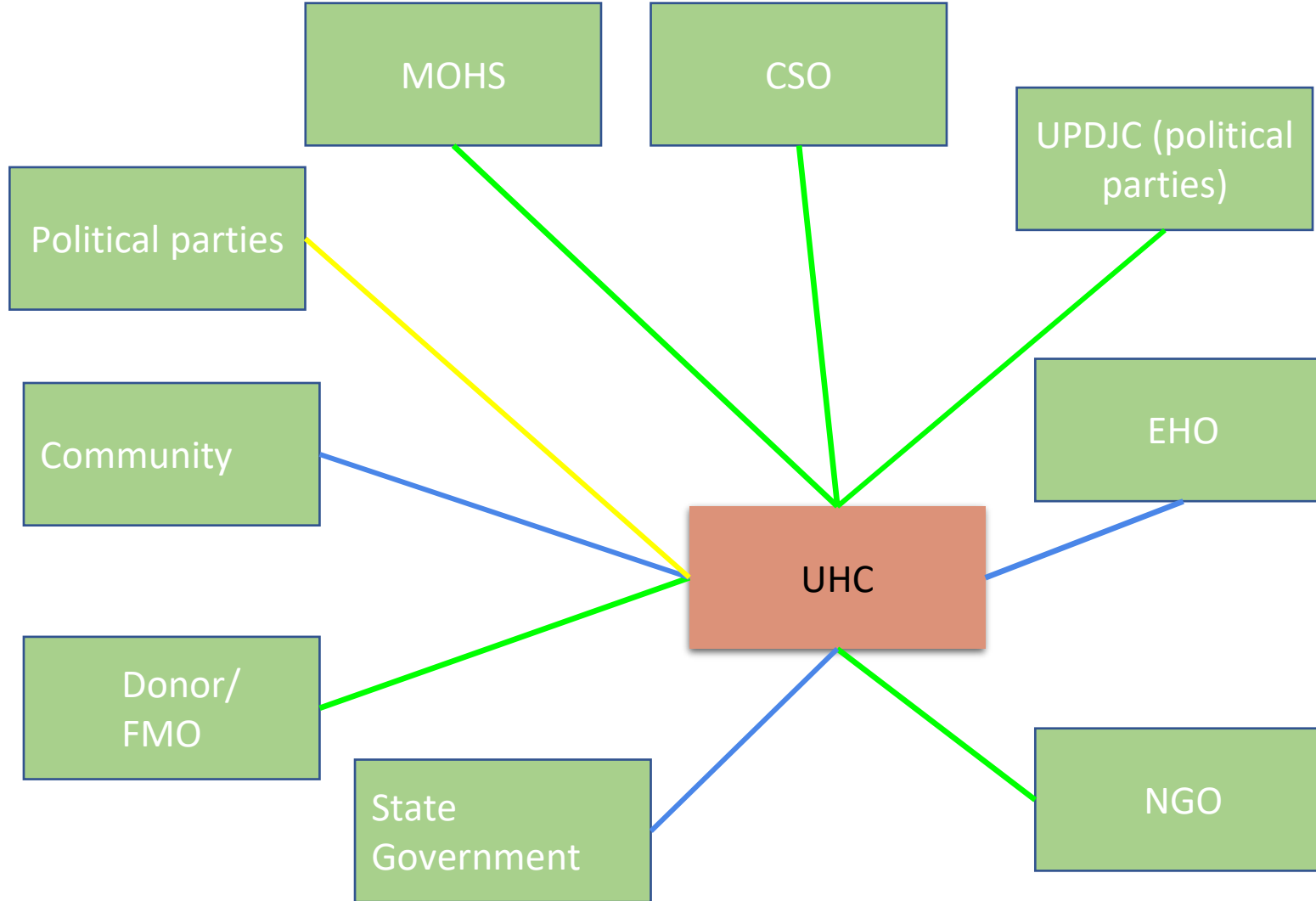

OUR ADVICE ON HOW TO LEAD COLLABORATIVELY TOWARDS UHC

- The L4UHC Myanmar team should have a continuous engagement mechanism among the team as well as with key stakeholders for achieving UHC
- The leadership and commitment is quite important for making the team alive.
- It is not the end, just the beginning of a new journey. The team members need to reflect ourselves and continue the capacity building.
- The lesson learnt from other countries should be learnt and applied in Myanmar setting (whenever appropriate).
- Individual - deep listening is important and need to apply, analyze and share as a daily practice.
- Organizing UHC day event in a collaborative way is quite critical and public attention on UHC is raised. This practice should be maintained.
- Take responsibility, share credit
